Frankie McGrath is a twenty-year-old nursing student who joins the army to go to Vietnam where her brother went after graduating from the Naval Academy.

Frankie grew up in southern California living a pampered life. Overseas, she is dropped into a nightmare that never ends. Finally, when she comes home, no one wants to talk about her experience. She eases her pain with alcohol. Most people do not know she was even there but also believe women did not participate in that war.

As she recovers, it is not until she visits the Vietnam Memorial in D. C. that she begins to understand all her trauma.

I could relate to this story as I grew up in the 60s.. A college friend left our freshman year to enlist in the Navy, a high school classmate was killed, and I stayed up to watch the draft lottery so I could see what number my brother was assigned. It was a tumultuous time.
